When I think back and start putting this all together it starts to paint a picture to me that there is a huge possibility that LA's taking all this water for the last 106 years could very well have been instrumental toward such detrimental affects on the areas from Mono to Owens to Kern Counties. I have never seen this possibility addressed before. Why?

If this probable revolt by Mother Nature can be proven and put together I do believe that would send LA packing to desalination and get the hell out of our area and our lives. In addition, if this kind of "taking" water from one place and building dams, piping or otherwise removing large amounts of water from natural storage areas to man-made facilities...which is happening and has been for years in many areas of the at least 17 western states...it opens the doors to actually solving many of today's huge water problems and averting the disasters such "interruption" of natural water flow and storage obviously causes.

My final observation and to-date research on this subject has led me to believe that solid proof to all this would be another slam-dunk address within any lawsuit that would just add more power to said lawsuits to find LA responsible for far more than just all the damage they, themselves have caused directly by just "taking" our water since they opened their first aqueduct in 1913. We already have the proof that LA has endangered the water availability to the residents of Mono, Inyo and Kern counties by the amount of water they have taken from our natural flow which, if it were not taken by LA would refill our IWV aquifer. LA's taking this water now appears to be responsible for causing additional, far-reaching and dangerous consequences to at least all three of the above-listed Counties.
