Dear President Trump,

Knowing this is an unusual problem to bring to the attention of the President of the United States, but also knowing that you have been a president that “pays attention” to the best interests of the United States of America plus the rights and welfare of we citizens, I am bringing this situation to your attention because between the California government in Sacramento and the Los Angeles Department of Water and Power these entities are on the verge of totally destroying the ability for sustainability of life on the eastern side of the southern Sierra Nevada mountains encompassing at least 300 miles to the north of Indian Wells Valley (approximately 150 miles north of Los Angeles) and from the eastern slopes of our Sierra Nevada Mountain Range to the Nevada border of this California area. Since this area includes the Indian Wells Valley; i.e., Kern County area, I have also contacted my U.S. Representative, Kevin McCarthy and have asked for a face-to-face meeting with him.

I believe this is a matter of Constitutional impact on not only the citizens of this vast area, but also will impact the Naval Weapons Center at China Lake and on south to Edwards Air Force Base in the Antelope Valley. Los Angeles is also diverting water from Antelope Valley into their Aqueduct system. There is also the fact that natural head-water flows are being diverted into the Los Angeles Aqueduct and this water initializes and flows from Federal property owned by the citizens of the United States and over seen by Bureau of Land Management and the U.S. Forest Service. This is just one area of California suffering from government overreach of bad and destructive impact on citizen’s rights to start with.

This matter has been escalating very fast here in our local area since Governor Brown and Sacramento Senate and Assembly have actually man-dated that this area is official identified by the State of California as an area suffering “**deficient aquifer replenishment**,” thus this governmental body has set up rules/laws/fees/penalties, etc. for all; i.e., not only public water providers, but also all private property owners’ private water wells. We citizens are being told we have absolutely no right to say yes or no to whatever this committee imposes upon all of us and if this committee does not come up with an aquifer sustainability plan by 2020 then the State of California will step in and take over. This committee was not elected but just “selected based upon the local political office they hold” as mandated by this Sacramento law (legality of which is questionable). The creation of same **We the people** were never allowed to participate. The local citizens do not approve of this “governmental shoving of political decisions down our throats to slam governmental politics on our heads” and threaten to take away our private water rights.

**I believe the Federal Government has jurisdiction over this tangled mess since the natural flow of water from northern headwaters have been disrupted by Los Angeles’s diverting same into their infamous Aqueduct and most of those headwaters initiate in both BLM and Forest Service lands. There are laws that establish that no “flowing” water may be stopped in the process of moving forward” (not exact wording but communicates the basis). This mess needs to be addressed from the standpoint of civil rights of property owners’ water rights which the California government is quickly moving in a manner that not only would ultimately erase but also be disastrous for every individual property owner’s water rights, in addition to we, the peoples’ Constitutional rights.**

Mr. President, is there any way you can pass down a request to whatever Federal entity can follow up on this. Thank you, Sir, and thank you for the great job you are doing to bring “sanity” back to politics in Washington, D.C.
