Memorandum

SUBJECT: Update...Our Submitted Plan of Solution

DATE: November 19, 2018

This is to inform our IWW Well Owners that we have now concluded the development of our plan which lays out the path for forward movement and takes us down the correct road for re-establishing the natural annual refill of our underground aquifer. The facts have long been recognized that the Los Angeles Department of Water and Power (LADWP) has been diverting large amounts of our Sierra Nevada Mountain Range eastern flowing head waters into the LA Aqueduct system since 1913 with those flow amounts increasing year after year. It is also a fact that this diverting and taking has created the near destruction of our valleys' lakes and rivers plus productive farm land, productive cattle ranches and human life from Mono, Inyo and our own Kern County areas. It is way past time to stop this destruction by "outsiders," and force them to replace the water they are "taking" from not only our area, but also from Fremont and Antelope Valleys south of us in addition to northern California plus several Western States with the modern-day desalination of their own western shores ocean water front.

With the volunteering of our IWW Well Owners' and concerned population's giving of their help, research and great sharing of same with me, I have been able to put a solid plan together which will absolutely correct this "taking" by Los Angeles, plus also correct permanently this intrusion anywhere in America and put America's water back into the hands of the owners of our public lands; i.e., "we, the people." Most of the waters flowing in our creeks, streams, rivers and underground aquifers originate as headwaters on public lands owned by "we, the people."

Since the LADWP is taking water that crosses state boundaries, this brings the Federal Government directly into pursuing correction. Our over-all plan has now arrived in the halls of Congress, The White House and the Department of Interior in Washington, D.C. Action on this procedure as shared with our political world will take time for the "halls of Washington D.C." to insert the fine minutia needed to make it all work and we here in IWW must follow up with our own constant monitoring of progress. It is also up to those of us who can always be available to help make this work so that no "entity," whether individual, corporate/business entities, organization, etc., etc., can ever again "take" water from one area which will always prove to be the destruction of that said area to provide benefit for fulfilling water shortage for whatever reason to another location of water shortage. Such is usually caused by over-development of that other area for the wrong reasons where local natural circumstances cannot support that area's obligation to provide the necessary water and other utilities needed to sustain and support such expansion. Thus, past operations such as the Los

Angeles Aqueduct taking our water over 200 miles south of us have arisen and proven to be very destructive to the areas from which they “take.”

I would ask our IWV Well Owners to please remain active and in-touch with each other in order to stay on top of making sure there is follow through at the highest levels to bring our plan to execution, said areas are the only government levels that can work with us to make this water issue work as it should. We must stop the “stealing” of water by such distance entities such as we have with Los Angeles. In addition, we should certainly and vehemently reject any thought of “buying” our water from outside sources including our own , technically-owned water from the Los Angeles Department of Water and power which will do absolutely nothing to actually “correct” our currently-existing problem which has been basically caused by the Los Angeles Department of Water and Power’s diverting of the natural flow of the head waters from the high elevations of our Sierra Nevada Mountain range which used to feed our refill supply. This has caused disaster from the original opening of that first LA Aqueduct from Mono County area on south at least down through Indian Wells Valley and on eastward toward Trona and further south of our valley.


I suggest that we IWV Well Owners need to somehow find a way to secure a place to periodically meet that is large enough to accommodate as many of us as possible to create better understanding, closer coordination and help each other to find each of our expertise areas which can, when shared and coordinated, solve this problem once and for all. We have our foot in the door to successfully righting our aquifer refill interference. Let us not just drop the ball now. It became quickly obvious that between Sacramento mandates and our local political responses which is only costing a tremendous amount of money and, ultimately, these two entities (Sacramento and IWVGWA) are going down the wrong path to nowhere, thus the current approach of these two government entities will do nothing to solve the problem.

Since the gathering together of your research, expertise and input came to rest on my desk along with my own research and analyzing of same opened the door to culminating same into my finalizing and producing this plan, I will be happy to be the contact to keep us together and somehow organize a way for us to periodically meet and share our abilities, positions and thoughts on taking back control of our water. In addition, I welcome anyone who wishes to volunteer to take on and/or share such responsibilities.

This includes my website address for my Arabian horse ranch, not for purposes of selling you an Arabian horse, but for purposes of giving you access to information on part of my background, past accomplishments and abilities to be able to seek and map out the path to solution of the problem(s) we currently face. In addition, I have set up a special page on my website for our water situation where I have uploaded much of this foundation information leading to our plan of solution, letters sent to our own politicians laying out the way they can act to start correcting the path, etc. thus, anyone with internet service has access.
